Santa Fe Road Number 3010



This Pullman 28-1 heavyweight parlor car is painted Pullman Green with metallic gold lettering. Owned by Santa Fe, it displays the 'Pullman' name across the top and road number across the bottom, also in metallic gold. It runs on six-wheel passenger trucks. The introduction of the steel cars brought the end of the luxurious, artisan-crafted and custom-designed wooden cars which had been the rule since the 1880s. With the opening of the Pennsylvania Station in New York in 1910 and the Grand Central Terminal in 1913, passenger safety in the tunnels approaching these buildings demanded a more noncombustible material than wood.

Burlington Northern Santa Fe Road Numbers BNSF 482710 / 482853



These three-bay Centerflow[®] covered hoppers with elongated hatches are painted brown with aluminum roofwalks and hatches. The cars are decorated with white BNSF 'wedge' logos, white lettering and yellow warning lettering. They were built in January 2006 and run on Barber Roller Bearing trucks. The BNSF Railway was formed December 31, 1996, as the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railway when the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe merged with the Burlington Northern Railroad. On January 24, 2005, the railroad's name was officially changed to BNSF Railway.

Chicago North Western[®]/Union Pacific[®] Road Number CNW 741048



This 50' steel side, 15-panel fixed end gondola is painted synthetic red with white logo and lettering. It bears the red, white and blue Union Pacific shield. It was built in July 1987 and runs on Barber Roller Bearing trucks. This gondola was painted and decorated with the UP shield sometime after Union Pacific acquired CNW in 1995, but retained its CNW reporting marks and remained part of its former series 741000-741100.

American Pacific Whaling Company Road Number APWX 7166



This 39' single dome tank car is painted black with white logo and lettering. It was built in September 1917 by American Car & Foundry of Milton, PA, and runs on Archbar trucks. The Pacific Whaling Company (later the American Pacific Whaling Company) opened the only whaling station in the Aleutian Islands in 1912. It operated until 1939, then was leased to the U.S. Navy between 1942 until 1945 as a midway fueling, provisioning and repair station.

CP Rail Road Number CPAA 211077



This 40' rib side box car with single door and no roofwalk is painted red with white lettering and white CP Rail logo. It also bears yellow reflectors. The built date is unknown, although the CPAA reporting marks seem to designate it was manufactured in the US and used mainly on US lines.

Southern Pacific[®] Road Number T&NO 383



This 34' wood sheathed caboose with slanted cupola is painted brown with orange ends and white herald and lettering. It was built in December 1928 and runs on swing motion caboose trucks. This railroad was originally chartered as the Sabine and Galveston Bay Railroad and Lumber Company in 1856; the name was later changed to the Texas and New Orleans Railroad in 1859. In 1881 C. P. Huntington, acting for the Southern Pacific Railroad Company, bought the Texas and New Orleans, making the Southern Pacific her parent company. In 1961 it was merged with parent company Southern Pacific and ceased to exist as a separate entity.

George H. W. Bush Presidential Car Road Number 1989-1993



This 40' standard box car with plug door and no roofwalk is car #28 of a 44-car series representing each of the presidents of the United States. It bears the portrait of our 41st president, George H. W. Bush. The car comes with a commemorative pin replicated from this era. Bush presidency; military operations were conducted in Panama and the Persian Gulf; the Berlin Wall fell in 1989; and the USSR dissolved two years later. During WWII, Bush was the youngest aviator in U.S. naval history. He received combat medals while serving on the USS San Jacinto.

Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey™ Road Number RBBX 84714



This 89' flat car is painted aluminum and lettered in black. It was built in the early 1970s, acquired by Ringling Bros.® in late 1980, and then assigned road number RBBX 84714 in 1999. Flat cars were often modified by Ringling Bros. to fit their specific needs. They carried autos, wagons with lighting, concessions and other equipment to the next arena.

Union Pacific® Road Number UP 217011



This 60' Thrall Centerbeam flat car is painted yellow with red logo and black and red lettering. It was built in March 1977 by Thrall Car Company and runs on Barber Roller Bearing trucks. Major production of Thrall's 60' loading length Centerbeam bulkhead flat car began in 1977 with orders from Burlington Northern, Milwaukee Road, Union Pacific and Western Pacific. One of the primary purposes of this design was to facilitate faster lading and unloading of lumber products. Previously, lumber was generally shipped in box cars, bulkhead flat cars, straight deck flat cars and sometimes gondolas.

Colorado & Northwestern Road Number 7



This 30' flat car is painted brown with white logo and lettering. It traveled the region of the Southwest in the late 19th and early 20th centuries on Arch Bar trucks. The Colorado and Northwestern Railway Company was chartered in 1897; in 1904 the railroad was sold under foreclosure to the Colorado and Northwestern Railroad Company which had been formed to operate the railway. The railroad was sold yet again in 1909 under foreclosure to become the Denver, Boulder and Western which operated until 1919. Part of the line's right-of-way is designated an historic district and is currently enjoyed as a hiking/biking trail that affords amazing views of the "Switzerland Trail of America."

**Delaware State Car
Road Number DE 1787**



This 40' Standard Box Car with plug door is car #30 of a 50-car series representing each of the 50 states in the union. It bears the Peach Blossom and Blue Hen Chicken, Delaware's official state flower and bird. The flag of the state of Delaware is in the background. The road number 1787 represents the year the 'First State' was admitted into the union.

Built in late 1958, this GP9 powered unit locomotive received its gold "hamburger" logos, gold lettering and new Pevler blue paint in 1966. Known as "Pevler Blue" for the then president of N&W Herman H. Pevler, this paint scheme only survived the life of Pevler's term as president, and was repainted shortly after his retirement in 1970. The EMD GP9 is a 4-axle diesel locomotive built by General Motors Electro-Motive Division between January 1954 and August 1963.

These 50' box cars with plug doors are painted gold with black ends. They bear black "Action Road" speed lettering logos, black lettering and green "No Damage" stripes. They were built in April 1955 by General American Transportation Company, serviced in October 1968 and run on Roller Bearing trucks. They belong to series 50900-50999 and run the South Western District.

**Pan Am Railway
Road Numbers MEC 32068**



This 50' rib side box car with single door and no roofwalk is painted blue with gray bands along sides and ends and bears the Pan Am "speed-lettered logo" and familiar Pan Am globe herald. It was built in November 1978 and runs on Roller Bearing trucks. Pan Am Railways (PAR), also known as Guilford Rail System (GRS) before March 2006, is a Class 2 railroad covering northern New England from Calais, Maine to Albany, New York. Pan Am Railways have operated from 1981 to the present.

**Canadian National
Road Numbers CN 521992 / 521999**



These 40' standard box cars with single doors are painted brown with green and white maple leaf herald and white lettering. It was built in January 1946 and runs on Bettendorf trucks. Canadian National is the largest railway in Canada, in terms of both revenue and the physical size of its rail network. It is currently Canada's only transcontinental railway, spanning Canada from the Atlantic Coast in Nova Scotia to the Pacific Coast in British Columbia. It also operates extensive trackage in the central United States along the Mississippi River valley at the Great Lakes to the Gulf of Mexico.

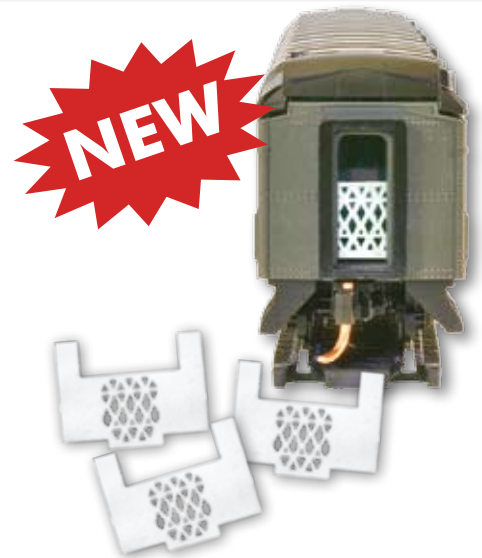
