New Meat Packer Reefer Series!

This 36' wood-sheathed reefer was built new by General American in December of 1925. It was repainted by General American's East Chicago shops in February of 1931. Billboard car side advertising was used extensively by meat packers, breweries and producers of food products, 1920's thru 1938. This form of advertising came about when freight car leasing companies realized they could make more money by letting the companies leasing their cars paint billboard ads on the sides of the cars.

Baltimore & Ohio^a Road Name St. Johns

This 83' Pullman heavyweight 12-1 sleeper is painted B&O dark blue with gray side and gold herald. It bears the name 'St. JOHNS'. It was built sometime during 1923 - 1925 from the Pullman plan #3410 and runs on six wheel passenger trucks. B&O had a large fleet of 12-1 Pullman sleepers from the 3410 and 2410 series of plans. Though these cars were all of the 12-1 configuration, the window and interior appliances were not all the same. The names are applicable for the cars as Pullman sleepers only. In the early 1950s as passenger service declined, they were withdrawn from Pullman lease. The sleeping accommodations were removed from them and the names were replaced with numbers at the outer edges of the car and then used as coaches.

Painted aluminum with yellow sides, these 50' rib side box cars were built in 1971. They are two of 99 cars in their dass B1-10-11 series built in 1971 at the Omaha freight car shop. They have no slogan applied to the side as UP began using the "We Can Handle It" slogan in 1972.



Canadian Pacific Road Name Steelton



This 83' Pullman heavyweight 12-1 sleeper is painted maroon with gold herald. It's One of 65 "S" sleepers built between 1930 and 1931 at the Canadian Car & Foundry and completed at the CP Angus Shops. "S" sleepers were named for towns along the CP line. These sleepers were generally in service thru the 1960s, then used as express rider cars or for charters and excursions and finally Maintenance-of-Way service.

Dwight Eisenhower Presidential Car Road Number 1953-1961

This 40' standard box car with plug door and no roofwalk is car #44 of a 44-car series representing each of the presidents of the United States. It bears the portrait of our 34th president, Dwight Eisenhower. The car comes with a commemorative pin replicated from this era. Eisenhower was a five-star general in the US Army. During World War II, he served as Supreme Commander of the Allied Forces in Europe.

Pennsylvania Railroad Road Number PRR 81999

This 50' PRR box car was built in February 1946. The journal boxes were repacked on May 10, 1951. Wearing its second paint scheme, the "Shadow Keystone" was in use from February 1954 thru June 1961. PRR "Calendar" lettering was used thru June 1954. After which, numbering was in a straight line. By 1968 there were only 80 remaining cars from the original 200 car fleet of class X41A box cars.

Road Number ERIE 7210

This Heavyweight Depressed-Center flat car was built in 1929 by the Standard Steel Company in Butler PA. This car was one of a five car fleet owned by Erie Railroad. It was equipped with 6-wheel Commonwealth trucks with one piece cast bodies, making them remarkably durable. Strong, lightweight and adaptable to customer's needs, the Commonwealth trucks helped to make possible smoother, more reliable transportation on the rails.

Cotton Belt[®] Road Number SSW 36003



This 40' hy-cube box car was part of a 100 car series built by Pullman Standard in October 1951 and numbered into PS series 33850-33949. In December 1965, the Pine Bluff Shops rebuilt 14 cars from this series. They were modified extensively for appliance service. These cars received "Hydra-Cushion systems and DF-2 loaders.

Southern Pacific® Road Number SP 659036

This 40' hy-cube was one of 40 cars rebuilt at the SP's SAC Shops in 1965. This sub-series, 659008-659047, is equipped with DF-2 loaders and rated at a 5936 cubic ft. capacity. These excess height cars were assigned to unique appliance loading on the Penn Central at Evansville, IND. 12 cars remained in the 1985 ORER. All were out by the 1992 ORER.




New Civil War Era N Scale Body Styles!

Micro-Trains is producing prototypically-accurate N scale models to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the American Civil War. This war was one of the first times railroads were used in both strategic and tactical roles on both sides of the conflict. Many private railroad "House Cars" from both sides were drafted into service hauling freight, ammunition, troops, and even fixed heavy artillery batteries right to the front.

Three car styles will initially be released: a standard 26' box car, a 26' nine-stake flat car and a converted box car/caboose. They will feature the usual fine mold detail, state-of-the-art decorating, as well as an all-new truck to maintain historical accuracy. Common during the 1860s, ridged frame trucks mounting 33" wheel sets gave the cars their distinctive stubby look. Micro-Trains will reproduce these in N scale for the very first time. Another first will be coupler options allowing the modeler to use the installed representative Link-and-Pin style couplers or a standard Magne-Matic[®] coupler.

George Hollwedel—Southern Pacific 3-pack

Starting in 1917 the Southern Pacific Railroad constructed over 620 Class C-30-1 wood cabooses with slant side cupolas making it the largest class of cabooses on the railroad. Many received replacement straight-side cupolas in later years. There were four main lettering schemes applied to this class over the years. This scheme was applied from 1946-1952 and would have been seen through the late 1950s. The price per 3-pack is \$97.95. They can also be purchased individually for \$33.95.
