

Gregi Northern Road Numbers GN 139020 / 139023



These 60' box cars with double plug doors are painted Great Northern's Glacier Green with white lettering and reflectors, and marked with the black, white and red "Rocky" logo. They were built by American Car & Foundry in November 1963, two of 50 cars within the series 139000-139049. They run the Northwest District on 100-ton Barber Roller Bearing trucks with 36" wheels. They were the only 60'-9" double-door series owned by the GN. In the early 1960s Ford Motor Company prodded the railcar manufacturers to design a fleet to meet changing conditions in the automotive industry. One solution was the 60' double plug door box car designed for transporting high-density components, such as castings and transmission assemblies. This design marked a revolution in railcar development.

Williams Brothers Road Number WBCX 85056



This three bay Ortner rapid-discharge hopper is painted white with black lettering and black and red logo. Built by Ortner Freight Car Company of Cincinnati, OH, this car was serviced in January 1992 and runs on Barber Roller Bearing trucks. Williams Bros. Lumber Co. had three truss and five millwork plants prior to its late-1980s spinoff by BlueCircle America, Atlanta's leader in concrete, aggregates and cement; Williams was a sister business.

Pennsylvania Railroad Road Number PRR 470130



Painted brown with white herald and lettering, this 50' fishbelly flat car was built in September 1929 and runs on Bettendorf trucks. One of 100 class F30 flat cars, this car represents the general purpose flat with a nominal $\frac{1}{2}$ capacity of 140,000lbs. and is a simple straight deck with a minimal amount of load securing equipment.

Built by General American in October 1928 and repainted in East Chicago in December 1930 for Jacob E. Decker & Sons of Mason City, Iowa. This car has the billboard "DECKER" lettering on the roof. Smithsonian Civil War Series Car #5: Great Locomotive Chase



"The Great Locomotive Chase" was a military raid that took place on April 12, 1862 in northern Georgia where volunteers from the Union Army commandeered the Confederate's W&ARR engine, the "General". They took it north toward Chattanooga, doing as much damage to the line as possible. Confederate forces pursued by foot and later by locomotive. Some of the raiders were caught and executed as spies. The escapees, called Andrew's Raiders, were later awarded the Medal of Honor.

Built in March of 1965 by Hawker Siddeley Canada Ltd., this 50' standard box car with plug door is painted light brown with white lettering on sides and ends. The shield is red and contains the words 'NEWSPRINT SERVICE ONLY' in white. The 'Canadian Pacific' script lettering was introduced in 1964 but was replaced by the CP multi-mark paint scheme in 1968. Through many acquisitions of other lines, by 1980 the CP had created a true transcontinental railroad from the Atlantic to the Pacific

This 50' gondola with fishbelly side and drop ends is painted mineral brown with white lettering and runs on brown roller bearing trucks. ATSF 75043 was built in January 1954 and was last serviced in April of 1974, at the Topeka, Kansas shop. The Atchison & Topeka Railroad was chartered in 1859 to join the cities of Atchison and Topeka then planned to continue southwest toward Santa Fe. "Santa Fe" was added to the corporate name in 1863.

British Columbia Railway Road Numbers BCR 753 / 756



These locos were built in 1980 by Electro Motive Division as part of order #C429 for the British Columbia Railway. They are painted a combination of dark and light green with a white delineating stripe and yellow rails. Featured on the cab is the dogwood logo along with 'British Columbia Railway' lettering in white. The SD40-2 is one of the best-selling diesel locomotive models of all time.




Decker Road Number DMRX 2834



Built by General American in October 1928 and repainted in East Chicago in December 1930 for Jacob E. Decker & Sons of Mason Gity, Iowa. This car has the billboard "DECKER" lettering on the roof. They were equipped with Evans load dividers and an ACF Freight-Saver cushioning system for additional protection of loads during transport.

This 50' standard box car with plug door was built in 1964 as part of series 360982-361160. It is painted brown with white lettering and Conrail logo. The creation of Conrail is the result of the reorganization of the bankrupt Penn Central by the USRA. Beginning operation on April 1, 1976, it took over the railroad operations of 6 bankrupt eastern railroads: (1) Central of New Jersey, (2) Erie Lackawanna, (3) Lehigh Valley, (4) Reading, (5) Penn Central, and (6) Lehigh & Hudson River.

In the spring of 1953, PFE repainted 50 of the 4,700 R-40-10 refrigerator cars for express service. The cars were then classed BR-40-10; they were numbered 901 through 950. The cars selected had been overhauled in 1951 and 1952 and given electric fans and steel running boards. The first 25 cars were given Chrysler FR-5-D trucks while the last 25 received Symington Gould Type XL. The price per 4-pack is \$109.95 with additional cars available for \$28.95 per individual car.
