Burlington Northern Road Name Pocomoke



This Burlington Northern heavyweight, named Pocomoke, is an 80' 12 section-1 drawing room sleeper built in 1910 from Pullman Plan #3410. It's painted Pullman Green with metallic gold 'PULLMAN' lettering above the windows. It ran nationally from 1910 to the 1930s on six-wheel passenger trucks. Pullman's heavyweight construction was modular, making it possible for floor plans to economically evolve with the times. Cars were generally in service through the 1960s.

Pennsylvania Railroad Road Numbers PRR 83030 / 83052



These 50' box cars with single sliding doors are painted Tuscan red with black and white keystone logo and white lettering. They were built in August 1958 and ran the Midwest on Bettendorf trucks. The cars in this series were the first new box cars for the Pennsy to carry the shadow keystone scheme. Equipped with 8' single doors, this series was also equipped with racks and used for auto parts traffic such as radiators, axles and engines.

This 40' standard box car with single Youngstown door and roofwalk is painted mineral red with white CN 'continuous line' logo, Canadian and Canadien on opposite sides, and white lettering. Part of series 474000-477849, this car was built in June 1938, serviced in June 1965, and runs on Bettendorf trucks.

Frisco Road Number SL-SF 72492



This PS-2 100 ton covered hopper is painted gray with black Frisco herald and lettering. It was built in 1971, serviced in May 1976, and runs on Barber Roller Bearing trucks. This group of 200 hoppers came from Pullman-Standard in March 1971, adding to the already 800-strong group purchased and leased in 1967. All received gravity outlets of either Wine or Miner types, except for a small group of 23 that were equipped with gravity-pneumatic outlets. The 1971s came with Morton and Elcon equipment.

Smithsonian Civil War Series Car #6: Battle of Antietam



The Battle of Antietam was fought on Wednesday, September 17, 1862, near Sharpsburg, Maryland, and Antietam Creek. It was part of the Maryland Campaign and was the first major battle in the American Civil War to take place on Union soil. It was the bloodiest single-day battle in American history, with about 23,000 dead, wounded and missing on both sides combined. The battle of Antietam led to Abraham Lincoln's issuance of the preliminary Emancipation Proclamation.

Agar Road Number APPX 317



This 40' steel ice reefer is painted box car red with reefer yellow sides. It bears a black herald, black side and white end lettering, and carries the black, red and white Agar logo. It was built in April 1948 and leased to Agar Packing Company of Chicago, IL, as part of the series numbered 300-399. Running on Bettendorf trucks, it has a 4'-wide hinged door, a 76,000 lbs. capacity and its bunkers can handle crushed, coarse or chunk ice.



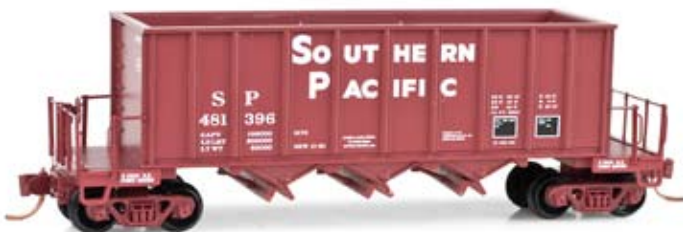

Southern Pacific® Road Number SP 481396



This 3-bay Ortner rapid discharge hopper is painted red with white herald and lettering. It was built in November 1981 by Ortner Freight Company of Cincinnati, OH, as one of the series 481150-481399 and runs on Barber Roller Bearing trucks. Built in November 1981, Ortner hoppers were stenciled with the familiar large Southern Pacific sans-serif road name. 250 cars numbered into the 481150-481399 series HTS class are rated at 100 tons; the 3-Bay Ortner can hold 2,300 cu. ft. level full and falls within 'Plate C' clearances.

These locos were built in 1949-1952 by Electro Motive Division (EMD). They are painted black with gray lightning stripes. Promoting itself as the "Water Level Route," NYC added 238 F-7 freight cabs during this time. They were powered by 4,500 HP 567 EMD diesel engines.

These 40' box cars with sliding single Youngstown doors are painted in the late 1940s 'Sentinel fast freight service' paint scheme with aluminum car, with blue masked sides, and blue and silver lettering. They bear the multi-colored 'Signal' heralds to the right of the doors. They were built in August 1945 by General American Transportation and run on Bettendorf trucks. Immediately after WWII, B&O introduced colorfully painted box cars designed to win-over shippers in response to the ever growing competition from trucks. This is the time B&O began its 'Sentinel Service' guaranteeing delivery dates to shippers.



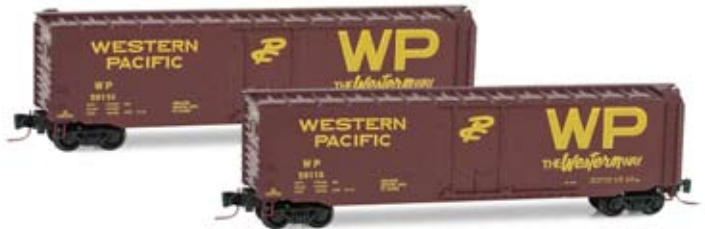

They were built in October 1959 by Pullman-Standard and run on Roller Bearing trucks. These PS-1 orders came with slightly wider 8-foot 7-inch plug doors and roller bearing trucks from several manufacturers.

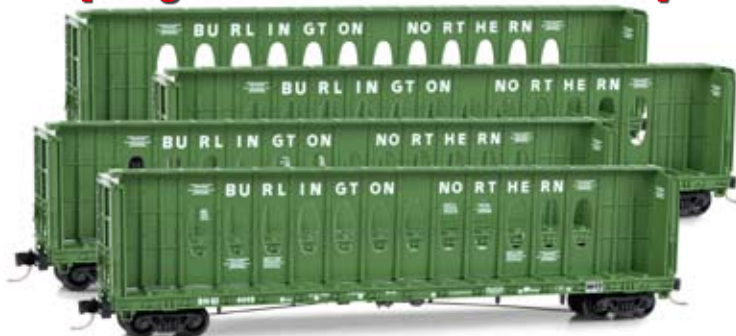
