

Candian Pacific Road Numbers CP 277095 / 277193



These 40' despatch stock cars are painted red with white masked sides. Lettering is both white and black on red placards. It was buily in 1958, serviced in September 1981, and runs on Bettendorf trucks. Numbered into a 200-car road series 277000-277199, they feature eight panels per side. Stock cars that were shopped before 1968 were left in their original Freight Car Brown with white paint; cars that were shopped after 1968 received the new CP Action Red and white paint. The lower portion of the stock car sides was painted white to camouflage the lime spray that was used to disinfect the cars after cleaning.







Micro-Trains collaborated with Eastern Seaboard Models to offer a bi-level auto rack featuring protective stainless steel vandal panels! The model has a light freight car red rack mounted on a yellow Trailer Train flatcar. It includes etched stainless steel vandal panels to represent the prototype as it appeared in the late 1970s and 1980s. As with the prototype, the deck flaps are not present. Prior to the appearance of enclosed auto racks, open frame auto racks were equipped with stainless steel panels to deter vandalism while in transit.

Balitimore & Ohio® Road Number B&O 187114



This black 100 ton three bay open hopper is lettered in yellow with yellow Chessie logo, "Chessie System" herald and B&O reporting mark and road number. It was serviced in December 1985 and runs on Barber Roller Bearing trucks. The B&O was the country's first common carrier, Class I railroad, and the first to offer scheduled freight and passenger service to the public. During its peak years, the railroad extended east to Staten Island, NY, and west to Illinois.

Empire Fuel Road Number GRYX 1018



This 40' double sheathed wood box car with single door and vertical brakewheel is painted black. Lettering is black with black herald and white with red drop shadows. It was built in November 1909, serviced in April 1931, and runs on Bettendorf trucks. This car was converted from a refrigerated car to one used in carrying the treated coal referred to as "Dustless Fuel."

Century Beer Road Number SNBX 4601



This 40' double sheathed wood reefer is painted brown with green sides, the century beer label to the left, and black printing to the right. It was built in August 1933 and runs on Archbar trucks. Burlington Refrigerator Express, which was operated by Fruit Growers for the CB&Q, leased small numbers of reefers to a number of private shippers in the 1930s. SNBX 4601 is one example from the Schneider Brewing Company of Trinidad, Colorado.

This 30' single dome tank car owned and operated by Warren Petroleum Corp. is an 8074 gallon, non-coiled insulated tanker with Bettendorf trucks built November 1948 from an order for 64 on lot# TC-3386 by American Car & Foundry. It's painted green on aluminum with black belly and underframe. The Warren logo is green and

This colorful 40' Standard Box Car is decorated in a similar stain glass motif to the Hanukkah Car released last year. The roof and ends are painted a yellow / gold color and the car was run in clear plastic to create a translucent effect for the stain glass design. This year's scheme features a multi-colored stain glass pattern and a close-up view of the Menorah candles to commemorate the eight-day Jewish holiday, also known as the Festival of Lights.

Toledo & Peoria Western Road Number TPW 18245



This three bay Evans covered hopper is painted Lobster Red with large TP&W logo and white lettering. It was built in August 1977 and runs the rail on Barber Roller Bearing trucks. The Toledo, Peoria and Western Railway (TPW) is a short line railroad that operates from Mapleton, IL through Peoria, IL, and on to Logansport, IN with trackage rights in other areas of Indiana and Illinois. The road transported more than 20,000 carloads in 2010, including agricultural commodities and chemicals, machinery, cement, feed meals and biodiesel, wind tower components, and high/wide shipments.

Western Maryland Road Number WM 5446



This 50' steel gondola with fishbelly sides and drop ends is painted brown with white herals and lettering. It was built by Bethlehem Steel in 1951, serviced in 1972, and carries a coke load on Bettendorf trucks. The Western Maryland Railway was an American Class I railroad which operated in Maryland, West Virginia, and Pennsylvania. It was primarily a coal hauling and freight railroad, with a small passenger train operation. The WM became part of the Chessie System in 1973 and ceased operating its lines in 1983 when it was merged into the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad.

Frisco Road Number SL-SF 90950



This 33' twin bay hopper with offset sides is painted brown with the large black and white 'Beaver Skin' logo and white lettering. It was built in May 1949, serviced in July 1963, and runs with a coal load on Roller Bearing trucks. The St. Louis—San Francisco Railway, also known as the Frisco, was a railroad that operated in the Midwest and South Central U.S. from 1876 to April 17, 1980. It was purchased and absorbed into the Burlington Northern Railroad in 1980.

This 40' general service drop bottom gondola is painted black with white herald and lettering. It was built in November 1936 by Pressed Steel Car Company, serviced in 1964, and runs on Bettendorf trucks. These tough little drop bottom cars were more versatile than the open hoppers or solid bottom gondolas also owned by the railroad and continued to be seen well into the 1970s, even after the merger into Burlington Northern.



These EMD F7 A and B unit locomotives are painted aluminum in a yellow 'Warbonnet' scheme with blue on the nose, blue lettering and herald, and black and red 'Hiawatha' logo. The EMD F7 was a 1,500 horsepower (1,100 kW) Diesel-electric locomotive produced between February 1949 and December 1953 by the Electro-Motive Division of General Motors (EMD) and General Motors Diesel (GMD). A total of 2,366 cab-equipped lead A-units and 1,483 cabless booster or B-units were built.

In February 1917, Ralston Steel Company delivered 450 of these class SM cars to Southern Pacific. It is a 40' despatch stock car with single door and is painted brown with white lettering. Railroads have long played a key role in livestock transportation. In the early days of perishable shipments, freshness was ensured if livestock could be delivered to market on the hoof. Stock cars were developed to meet this need. Southern Pacific, with over 11,000 miles of track, has been a major mover of livestock.

Pennsylvania Road Numbers PENNSYLVANIA 257152 / 257223



These PS-2, 70-ton two-bay covered hoppers are painted grey with the "Shadow Keystone" logo and lettering in black and run on black Bettendorf trucks. PRR constructed the 400 class H34A covered hoppers at Altoona during June 1955, using components fabricated by Pullman-Standard. The roof hatches have been moved outward toward the car ends and have been stenciled with the less stylized variation of PRR's "Calendar" font. The H34-types were the first PRR covered hopper cars to be turned out new in gray paint with black stenciling.

This 60' Flat Car is painted Navy grey with black lettering and carries a 40' Olive Drab Container featuring real WWII nose art known as 'Heavenly Body'. Like many planes in WWII, this B-25J bomber was decorated with custom artwork by its pilot to personalize the plane. The 'Heavenly Body' B-25J bomber was part of the 13th Air Force, the 42nd Bomb Group and 390th Squadron.

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
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




George Hollwedel—Pacific Fruit Express UP/SP 3-pack
